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History

Our School claim to promote domestic and international affairs and strategic academic research, train professionals in this field; established on March 23, 1982, grant degrees in International Affairs and Strategic Studies; become the Taiwan first civil higher academic unit and professor of strategic studies. The first director is the general Pee Zong Gan who officially took office on March 1983 and the institute named “Institute of International Affairs and Strategic Studies”.

Thereafter directors are respectively Zhang ShiQi, Kong LingCheng, Lin YuFang and Li ZiYi who continued to enrich teaching and curriculum including domestic long term strategic research pioneer professor Niou XianZhong who has been a long time professor of our institute. Authors and translators, all domestic and foreign classic strategic researchers, gradually spur the internal strategic research.

In 1996, Dr. Wong Ming-hsien become the director of the institute, whose research have value of governmental policies, established the Executive Master Degree to provide defense department and all community workers with possibility to learn International Affairs and Strategic practical conduit.

In 2002 our institute first generation graduated alumni, Dr. Alexander Huang succeeded as director of the institute, one year later he become the vice president of the Mainland Affairs Council; and Dr. Wang GaoCheng to take over the office of institute director in August 2003.

In 2007 our institute has been authorized by the minister of education to establish the doctoral program, believing that the country should foster high level professionals in international affairs and strategic studies; and internally and worldwide well known strategic researchers including prof Rong Yu, Dr. Wei He, ex-president of Mainland Affairs council Dr. Zhang JingYu, ex-director of minister of education Dr. Su ZhiWei to be the professors of the institute. The ex-vice president of National Defense department, Dr Lin ZhongBin become a faculty member.

Dr. Wong, Ming-hsien resume office in August 2009 as director of institute; to improve the resources quality and quantity for the students, besides recruiting foreign students, from year 2011 acceptance of preparatory master students, 2014 established “National Security and Diplomatic Practices” Credits module, moreover promote Tamkang Strategic School to be the pioneer in Taiwan Strait and internationally a famous Institute of International Affairs and Strategic Studies.

From August 2015, Dr. Li ,Da-jung is the institute’s director, to promote proficient knowledge of international news and production talents, and enhance

student's practical experience and knowledge, set up "Tamkang University International Relations and Media Professional studies" module in order to unify learning and practice, improve students' competitiveness at workplace, and develop future employment guidelines.

In short, our institute has been established for 39 years, has developed a long history in theory and practice under the leadership of well-known faculty, provided the country with 1034 graduates with doctoral, and master degrees; each working in various fields such research, administration, legislation, media and private enterprises, constituting achievement and bringing contribution to domestic's international affairs and Strategic studies.

Precautions for foreign student (**Master**) taking course

32 credits for graduation

- (1) MA credits from the GIASS
 - (2) MA credits (which teaching in English or the other languages) from College of international studies
 - (3) Electives courses by college of international studies (teach by professor)
- A minimum of 26 elective credits**

- (1) On-the-job graduate program (EMBA)
 - (2) Ph.D. credits from the GIASS
 - (3) MA credits from other departments
- Up to 6 credits** may count toward graduation requirement

Precautions for foreign students :

- Students who select “Chinese Language Class” must attend the class. While the course will not count toward required credits for graduation, the score will count in your total score that may affect your Taiwan scholarship.
- Students can select any course within the GIASS. Only the courses specified with “taught in foreign language” may count toward the credits required for graduation. Others will be subject to the limitation of 6 admissible credits.

Regulation of **Master** program of GIASS, Tamkang University

2021.07.27

1. **Length of Study:** 2 to 4 years (4 semesters to 8 semesters)
2. **Prescribed Credits for Master Degree:** 32 credits .
3. If you want to take other institutes' or colleges' credits, we can count 6 (elective course) credits at most in the prescribed.
4. If you take other colleges' credits which are taught by our institute professors, these can be counted in the prescribed credits. (elective course)
5. Foreign students are allowed to take courses within "The International faculty", but ONLY the courses that is taught in English. Chinese courses outside this institute can only take 6 credits at most in total, and those 6 credits are included in 32 credits.
6. Finish Center for Taiwan Academic Research Ethics Education class or pass "Academic ethics test" online before Apply for oral defence.
7. **Thesis Procedures:**
 Find an advisor -> Deliver the proposal of thesis -> Pass the comprehensive exam -> Apply and schedule the final oral exam in defense of thesis -> Pass the final oral exam in defense of thesis
 (1) In the 3rd semester, students have to find an advisor to consult your thesis, deliver the proposal of thesis and pass the comprehensive exam.
 (2) In the end of the 3rd semester, students should have acquired 32 credits.
 (3) In the 4th semester, students have to apply and schedule the oral examination for your thesis.
 (4) The oral defense will be held in June or Jan.
8. For those who take the Chinese courses (which will be included into total credits), please DO attend those classes, otherwise "Taiwan scholarship applicants" will be affected.
9. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask the office. We will do our best to help you.

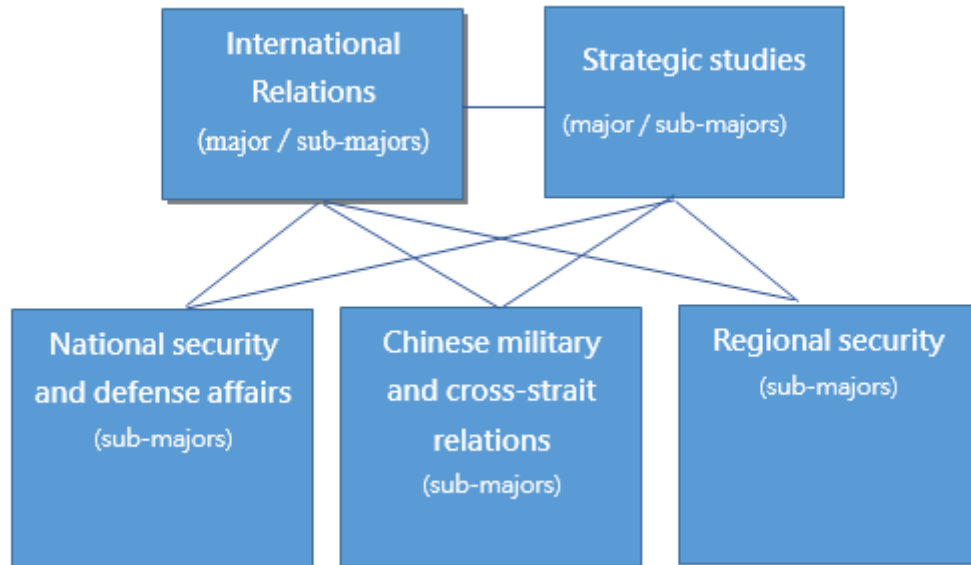

Master Degree Important Information

- **Year of Study:** 1-4 years, (able to suspension for 2 years)
- **Course elective:**
 - Minimum 1 course per semester, maximum 15 credit per semester
 - Maximum 6 credits will be admitted as graduate credit when you pick the course from other department/ Ph.D courses/ EMBA courses.
 - Foreign students able to pick the course open by College of international affairs, but the courses should be noted 'All english programme', otherwise it still be limited at 6 credits.
- **Graduate requirements:** finish 32 credits(include thesis 0 credit)
 1. Same education system, please enroll the course from internet, pick the course from other educational system, please fill the form.
 2. Same course name and same course number, will be counted once in graduate credit. Please pay attention on the result report's course number.
 3. According to 'Student enroll rule' 8.1, master degree student who pick the course belongs to other department/ different system and other schools, must get the agreement from original department, other department and professor. Pick the course of other education system 1 subject as limit per semester, total 6 credits from above will be counted as graduate credit.
 4. Students able to apply the pre-work for graduation (such as advisor application, thesis proposal review, test) . You able to apply oral defense while taking the course, but limited 1 course during the semester. After finishing the pre-work, you able to apply the oral defense next semester.
 5. Please read through the oral defense application guidelines.

Ph.D. students Curriculum Rules for International Students



1. The duration of your study must be from 2 to 7 years. The minimum required credits for graduation: 32 credits (thesis excluded). You should take 3 courses of 1 major (International Relations or Strategic Studies), 2 courses each for 2 sub-majors (International Relations, Strategic Studies, National Security and National Defence, PRC Military and Cross-Strait Relations, and Regional Research)
2. The maximum credits for each term is up to 12.
3. You can select up to 6 credits from outside the department/institute and 6 credits from the master program of the department/institute (Executive Master Program and College of International Studies not included) .
4. You cannot have more than 1/3 of your total credits from other schools in each term. (ex. maximum taken credits for each term is 12, that means you can only take 4 from other schools). This institute only recognises 6 credits for graduation.

Regulation of **Ph.D** program of GIIASS, Tamkang University

1. The duration of your study must be from 2 to 7 years. The minimum required credits for graduation: 32 credits (thesis excluded). You should take 3 courses of 1 major (International Relations or Strategic Studies), 2 courses each for 2 sub-majors (International Relations, Strategic Studies, National Security and National Defence, PRC Military and Cross-Strait Relations, and Regional Research)
2. The maximum credits for each term is up to 12.
3. You can select up to 6 credits from outside the department/institute and 6 credits from the master program of the department/institute (Executive Master Program and College of International Studies not included) .
4. You cannot have more than 1/3 of your total credits from other schools in each term. (ex. maximum taken credits for each term is 12, that means you can only take 4 from other schools). This institute only recognises 6 credits for graduation.
5. If you already study more than 24 credits, you can apply for taking the Ph.D Qualification Exam. The subjects include 1 major and 1 sub-major.
 - I. The application period is twice a year: October and March. Based on when you apply, the exam will be in either December or May.
 - II. Grade: 70 (out of 100) is required. If you fail it, you can redo the exam a year later for one time only, but you cannot change your exam fields.
 - III. Once you decide the fields, the professors who have taught you will set exam papers. Each of them will prepare 2 questions, and you will pick from those questions they have given. The professors are allowed to give you book list to study for the exam.
 - IV. Major and sub-major exam will be taken separately, each of them will take 3 hours. You can either answer it on papers or on a computer. Open-books, Internet resources, or laptops are forbidden to use.
6. How to become a Ph.D candidate and how to offer your thesis proposal
 - I. Candidacy: Have enough credits and pass the qualification exam.

- II. You will be able to select your advisor and hand in your thesis proposal once you get the candidacy. The thesis proposal should be published and approved by at least 3 members of the advisory committee. Members of the advisory committee are put forward by your advisor, and they will also join the oral defence. You are eligible to apply for an oral defence when the thesis proposal has been passed for one term.
7. How to apply for an oral defence:
 - I. Your thesis proposal is passed
 - II. The related pages or the acceptance of your journal from an academic journal
8. Ph.D student has to publish 2 theses in academic journal(s) with an anonymous review system inside/outside Taiwan, or to publish 1 thesis in an academic journal with an anonymous review system in/outside Taiwan plus to present 1 thesis at a symposium in/outside Taiwan. Then you can apply for the oral defence.
9. Ph.D student should participate in 2 symposia every term in/outside Taiwan. You have to join 6 symposia in order to graduate.
10. Finish Center for Taiwan Academic Research Ethics Education class or pass “Academic ethics test” online before Apply for oral defence..
11. Tamkang University Implementation Guidelines for Graduate Students' Academic Research Ethics Education Courses

Secretariat Regulation No. 1070000048 (11/13/2018)

Article 1

In order to elevate the disposition of graduate students toward research ethics and provide them with the necessary and proper ethical cognition and attitude for engaging in academic research, the course of "Academic Research Ethics Education" (hereafter abbreviated this course) has been established as implementation guidelines.

Article 2

From the 2017 academic year, students entering the master's class, master's in-service class, doctoral class, must access the Taiwan Academic Ethics Education Resource Center website (<https://ethics.nctu.edu.tw/>) and individually view and study this course; and they must pass the online test and standard of this course. After obtaining a certificate of proof of taking this course, and after presenting it to the administrative personnel of the college, department, graduate institute or degree program for inspection, students can then apply for the degree examination.

Article 3

Students that belong to a college, department, graduate institute, or degree program where there is a compulsory related course offered about academic research ethics can be exempted from the above requirement.

Article 4

If students have already taken a course related to "Academic Research Ethics Education" of 6 hours, they can present proof of attendance during the semester they enter the school and then apply to the college, department, graduate institute, or degree program they belong to for exemption. After being approved, they are exempt from taking the course.

Article 5

These guidelines after being passed by the Academic Affairs Committee and reported to the university's president for ratification will upon the day of publication take effect; any amendments to these guidelines will follow the same procedure.
